Article 324

- The authority to enforce a judicial or arbitral award expires twenty years after the start of the day following that of the award, or, if requirements have been imposed for its enforcement, the fulfillment of which does not depend on the will of the person who obtained the ruling, after the start of the day following that on which these requirements have been met.
- If, before the limitation period has expired, one of the parties files a legal remedy or a claim to challenge the conviction to be enforced, the period will not begin until the day following the day on which the proceedings in this regard ended
- The limitation period is five years with regard to what must be paid pursuant to the judgment in the year or shorter period.
- With regard to interest, fines, penalty payments and other additional sentences, the limitation period, unless interrupted or extended, commences no later than the limitation period for the authority to enforce the main conviction.
